The senior management team at Royal Wolf - Armada Place, a United Rentals company is committed to reducing its environmental impact to ensure sustainability for future generations. This is consistent with our strategic direction as will assist us to be recognised by our customers as the first choice is containerised solutions.

ISO 14001 Certification has been adopted as a framework to assist the business to identify and reduce its environmental impacts. We are committed to ensuring the environmental management system is adequately resourced, is effective and achieves its intended results, as it underpins future relationships with new customers and is consistent with our strategic direction.

Using our design and construction capabilities, Royal Wolf will seek to reduce its environmental impact throughout the container's product lifecycle. This will include determining and reducing the environmental impact at each step of the process from sourcing through to dispatch. It will also consider the container's environmental impact throughout the containers' lifecycle including decommissioning where reasonably practicable.

We are committed to ensuring ongoing support to all members of the Wolf Pack to ensure the quality management system and its processes are effective, maintained, followed, fully implemented, kept current and where practical, are continuously improved.

All employees, subcontractors and visitors to site must take all reasonable and practical measures to minimise any environmental harm the activity may cause.

We are committed to assisting all of our suppliers, contractors and customers in their efforts to reduce their impact upon the environment, where reasonable and practical. The quality objectives have been set using the following framework:

- Consideration of energy use and generation of other climate change gases
- Contamination of water, air and soil
- Capabilities and resources of the organisation, including the cost of some improvements
- Opportunity to drive improvement

Our Objectives are:

- 100% compliance with all environmental legal requirements

- Total amount of energy, recovered recyclables and materials sent to landfill be measured, reported, and made accessible to the organisation on a monthly basis.
- 5% reduction in energy will be achieved by end of calendar year 2022.
